SUBJECT: Wildlife Management Hunting Policy

1. References: Related publications and prescribed forms are listed in Appendix A.
2. Purpose: This policy sets responsibilities, and procedures for the Fort Lee recreational hunting program in support of the Fort Lee wildlife management mission. It applies to all personnel on Fort Lee, VA.
3. State and Federal Laws: All persons participating in the hunting program on the installation shall comply with state and federal fish and game laws, and all Army and Fort Lee regulations. They will cooperate fully with law enforcement agencies. Violators of this regulation will be referred to the US Magistrate or appropriate state authorities for disposition.
4. Boundary Definition: Fort Lee is broken down into two main and one minor hunting area as described below:
 - a. The Range Complex is defined as that area north of Temple Avenue (Route 144) and east/southeast of River Road and west of Interstate 295.
 - b. Cantonment area is defined as the main post area plus the Ordnance Campus or that area south of Route 144.
 - c. There is a satellite parcel of 52 acres that lies east of I295 across from the Range Complex which is accessible to deer hunters.
5. Enforcement: The Garrison Commander has delegated law enforcement authority to Fort Lee's Provost Marshal Office (PMO). They will protect wildlife and wildlife habitat, protect the hunting community, protect installation property and facilities, and ensure the safety of the public to the fullest degree possible.

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6. Violations:

a. Violators of federal and state game laws shall be subject to prosecution before the US Magistrate and/or the appropriate state court. Actions taken under the Uniform Code of Military Justice or the US Magistrate may be in addition to administrative suspension or revocation of hunting privileges.

b. The Garrison Commander retains the authority to suspend or revoke hunting privileges on Fort Lee. Fort Lee wildlife enforcement personnel have the authority to temporarily suspend hunting privileges pending action by the Garrison Commander. Report of violations will be forwarded to the Garrison Commander for appropriate action. Personnel will be officially notified of long-term suspension or revocation of privileges by letter from the Garrison Command office.

7. Unlawful Conduct While Using Hunting Facilities.

a. It is unlawful to hunt while under the influence of intoxicants or narcotic drugs. Violation will result in revocation of hunting privileges.

b. It is unlawful to disrupt operations at the Outdoor Recreation Office and wildlife check stations or interfere with any other individual using these facilities.

8. License Requirements. The following licenses and permits are required before hunting on the installation:

a. Fort Lee Permit. All personnel (including family members who are hunters) must have in their possession a valid Fort Lee permit while hunting. Annual permits may be purchased at the Outdoor Recreation Office, Building 15014, during normal business hours Monday – Friday, 9:00 am to 5:00 pm, Saturday, 8:30 am- 12:30 pm, closed Sunday and Holidays. For more information (804)765-2212.

b. The following requirements must be met in order to obtain a Fort Lee permit:

(1) All hunters must have a valid Virginia State hunting license and appropriate tags.

(2) All personnel hunting on Fort Lee must attend and pass a Virginia State hunter education course or a similar course given by any other state before they will be permitted to hunt on Fort Lee.

(3) All personnel must attend the Fort Lee Post Hunting Safety Briefing annually.

(4) All personnel must pass an annual proficiency test for each weapon type they plan to use prior to being issued a post permit. Qualifications will be good for one year. Family Morale Welfare and Recreation (FMWR) fees are the responsibility of the hunter.

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c. All personnel who are issued post permits will be required to sign a statement (sample at Appendix C) releasing the US Government and all in authority from responsibility for any injuries resulting from duds (unexploded ordnance), mines, barbed wire, falling into craters, or any other injury resulting from hazards incident to hunting on the installation.

d. The loan or transfer of hunting permits is prohibited.

e. An adult must accompany any authorized hunters under 16 years of age.

f. All persons will have appropriate license, installation permit, and identification in their possession while hunting and will display it upon request to any person authorized to enforce the laws and regulations referred to or prescribed in this regulation.

9. Days Open To Hunting. Authorized hunting days and hours will be posted at the FMWR Outdoor Recreation Center. Sunday hunting is not authorized. There are two types of hunting days scheduled on Fort Lee. They are classified as Recreational Hunting Days (RHDs) and Wildlife Management Days (WMDs).

a. Recreational Hunting Days: RHDs are regular hunting days that pertain to all hunting seasons and all game species. A routine request made to occupy a Training Area for hunting is noted as an RHD.

b. Wildlife Management Days: WMDs are specific to deer hunting, and represent days specifically scheduled on the Range complex during deer pre-rut and rut when deer harvesting opportunity is maximized. These days normally occur over a three week period coinciding with the end of archery-only season and the beginning of VA State Muzzleloader season (late October through mid-November) and are the optimum hunting times when both deer herd management and hunter's goals can be met.

b. Scheduling Hunting Days:

(1) RHDs are scheduled by FMWR through Directorate of Plans, Training, Mobilization and Security (DPTMS). They are requested within a 30-day window of opportunity, and are afforded no special conditions when competing with Training requirements. Only training areas that directly support hunting need to be scheduled through DPTMS. RHDs may be bumped for training scheduled prior to the 14-day reserved date. When a valid training requirement materializes within the 14-day hunting window, it must be adequately justified by the unit chain

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of command and can then be approved by DPTMS. Additionally, DPTMS may approve a valid training request that is properly justified by a customer and close down hunting in specific training areas in support of training for that day.

(2) WMDs are scheduled in consultation with the Environmental Management Office (EMO) through DPTMS with coordination and recommendations from the hunting community. There are 21 dedicated WMDs authorized each deer season. These days must be scheduled as early as possible each year in order to reserve the referenced hunting days and to avoid training conflicts. To better support training, these days do not need to be scheduled consecutively, but every attempt will be made to reserve as many days as possible within the three-week optimum window. Training requests submitted by a unit that conflict with the days already requested for WMD will only be approved after all efforts have been made to reschedule any conflicting training requests. Training can bump WMDs only after all of the following conditions have been met:

(a) Efforts to reschedule training have failed;

(b) Valid written justification for late scheduling of a training area and approval through unit's chain of command has been received;

(c) The Garrison Commander makes the decision to override schedule WMD.

10. General Hunting Regulations.

a. Hunter Control. Hunting areas are filled on a first come first served basis at the discretion of Outdoor Rec. The Outdoor Recreation Office will coordinate with DPTMS Range Control to determine the availability of areas. Areas opened or closed for hunting will be announced by posting the information at the Hunting Center.

(1) In order to promote safety and accountability of personnel, everyone must sign out before entering an open hunting area. Each individual will personally sign out/in on the appropriate sign out sheets. Authorized family member hunters under 16 years of age will be signed out/in for hunting on the same sign-out line as their parent or guardian.

(2) Fall turkey hunting in the range complex may be conducted with shotguns while roaming including when the season overlaps with deer muzzleloader season. A deer hunter with a muzzleloader rifle may harvest a turkey that comes within range from their stand, but they may not roam while hunting with a muzzleloader.

(3) Hunters must annotate on the sign out sheet what species they are hunting if other than deer.

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(4) Hunters are prohibited from signing out for more than one area or stand at the same time.

(5) Vehicle control cards showing assigned hunting area/stand will be provided at time of sign out and will be displayed in the vehicle window when parked. Vehicle control cards will be turned in at the end of each hunt. Vehicle control cards are required during scouting and all hunting seasons. The Garrison Commander can grant an exception to the above sign-out policy during organized hunts.

(6) Sign out/sign in will be done in person at the FMWR Outdoor Recreation Office for any areas that are open for hunting on Fort Lee. Forms not completely filled out constitute a failure to sign out/in. Telephone calls are not acceptable. The first violation will result in a written warning. The second violation will result in a one-week suspension of hunting privileges. The third violation may result in revocation of Fort Lee hunting privileges.

(7) Accounting for Hunters Not Signed In. All hunters must return to FMWR Outdoor Recreation Office and sign in no later than one hour after legal shooting hours. If a hunter has not signed in by closing time, FMWR will attempt to contact the individual by telephone. If the hunter is not at home, FMWR will conduct a physical search of the hunting area and request assistance if needed. After the hunter is accounted for he can then sign back out and recover a wounded animal.

(8) Safety belts/harnesses must be used on all elevated stands with the exception of closed tower stands.

(9) Scouting in advance of hunting season is prohibited on Fort Lee.

(10) No person shall take any animal on the installation except as authorized by state, federal, Army, and/or installation regulations. No person shall kill or cripple any animal without making a reasonable effort to retrieve the animal. Do not leave assigned area to retrieve a crippled animal. Contact FMWR Outdoor Recreation or the Game Warden for assistance. Report all crippled animals to FMWR Outdoor Recreation Office personnel or the Game Warden.

b. Manner of Taking.

(1) All game harvested will be taken to FMWR Outdoor Recreation Office for applicable recording and the collection of biological data in the case of deer. Deer and turkey harvested will be tagged before removing them from the kill site.

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(2) Possession of Live Animals. Every game animal wounded by hunting and reduced to possession by the hunter shall be killed immediately and become a part of the daily bag. No person shall at any time, or by any means, possess or transport live game animals taken under authority of this regulation.

(3) State and Federal seasons and bag limits on migratory game birds and small game are adopted as installation regulations.

c. Prohibited Activities. The following prohibited activities may also be subject to applicable state or federal penalties.

(1) Entering any "restricted" zone marked and designated as restricted on the master-hunting map located at FMWR Outdoor Recreation Center. The first violation will result in a written warning. The second violation will result in a one-week suspension of hunting privileges. The third violation may result in revocation of Fort Lee hunting privileges.

(2) Hunting or discharging any firearm within 100 yards of the centerline of a named roadway, of any hardtop roads on the Range Complex, or within 100 yards of a housing area or occupied building is prohibited. Violation will result in a one-week suspension of hunting privileges. Second violation may result in revocation of Fort Lee hunting privileges.

(3) Driving a motorized vehicle on firebreaks for hunting or locating game. Firebreaks will be used for the sole purpose of walking to and from the individual hunter's hunting area. Hunters will make an effort to enter and leave the hunting area as quickly and quietly as possible so as not to disturb other hunters in the area. The first violation will result in a written warning. The second violation will result in a one-week suspension of hunting privileges. The third violation may result in revocation of Fort Lee hunting privileges.

(4) Mutilating any bird or animal to obscure the sex or age of the carcass. Violation will result in revocation of Fort Lee hunting privileges.

(5) Taking game birds or game animals by baiting. Violation will result in revocation of Fort Lee hunting privileges.

(6) Use of any electronic or recorded devices except in compliance with state law. Violation will result in a one-week suspension of hunting privileges. Second violation may result in revocation of Fort Lee hunting privileges.

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(7) Erection of any tree stand or platform attached by nails, screws, bolts, or wire to a tree on the installation for the purpose of hunting. This prohibition shall not apply to lag screw steps or portable stands that can be removed after use with no metal left in or attached to the tree. The first violation will result in a written warning. The second violation will result in a one-week suspension of hunting privileges. The third violation may result in revocation of Fort Lee hunting privileges.

(8) No unauthorized person shall use or direct the rays of a spotlight or other artificial light, or automotive headlights for the purpose of spotting, locating, or taking any animal within the boundaries of the installation or along rights-of-way for public or private roads within the installation. Violation will result in a one-week suspension of hunting privileges. Second violation may result in revocation of Fort Lee hunting privileges.

(9) Transporting a loaded weapon in a vehicle. A loaded weapon is one that contains ammunition in the chamber and/or magazine. Muzzleloaders can have a round in the chamber, but the firing cap must be removed or the powder removed from the flash pan. Violation will result in a one-week suspension of hunting privileges. Second violation may result in revocation of Fort Lee hunting privileges.

(10) The use of the following weapons and ammunition while hunting or while traveling to or from hunting site: slugs; lead shotgun shells while hunting migratory waterfowl; pistols, revolvers, or rifles (except muzzleloader rifles). Violation will result in a one-week suspension of hunting privileges. Second violation may result in revocation of Fort Lee hunting privileges.

(11) The use or possession of any alcoholic beverage or illegal drugs while using the hunting facilities including the sign out/sign in lines, wildlife check stations, and hunting areas is not allowed on Fort Lee. Violation will result in revocation of hunting privileges on Fort Lee.

d. Additional Fort Lee Regulations.

(1) All game will be brought to FMWR Outdoor Recreation Office for applicable reporting or tagging. Deer killed on Fort Lee will be tagged in accordance with Virginia hunting regulations.

(2) Large Game, Deer Only. State established limits on game animals include animals taken on Fort Lee and elsewhere in Virginia. The total bag includes the various seasons, i.e., bow and arrow, muzzleloader, and firearms. All deer taken within the installation boundaries must be reported to the FMWR Outdoor Recreation Office personnel. The first violation will result in a written warning. The second violation will result in a one-week suspension of hunting privileges. The third violation may result in revocation of Fort Lee hunting privileges.

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e. Deer Hunting Areas. Deer hunting areas, authorized weapons, and hunter density for various areas will be designated by FMWR in conjunction with a review by Safety, DPTMS (for primary Training Areas), and concurrence by the Hunting Council. All hunting areas and stands will be subject to annual review as directed by the Hunting Council.

f. Archery Hunting. Archers may hunt any area open to hunting. Some areas may be designated exclusively for bow hunting.

g. General Firearms Deer Season. Stalking is not permitted on Fort Lee. All hunting will be done from tree stands. Hunters using shotguns or muzzleloaders in the cantonment area (if allowed) must hunt from designated stand sites. Hunting is permitted only in those areas posted as open at the FMWR Outdoor Recreation Center. Hunting is prohibited in all areas that are occupied or being used for training. Firearm hunters observing any troop activity within an area in which they are hunting will cease hunting and report the activity to FMWR.

h. Firearms Deer Season, Either Sex. Either sex deer hunting with firearms is authorized in accordance with state law. Special Fort Lee regulations are included in Appendix D.

i. Drive hunting is prohibited unless specifically authorized by the Garrison Commander. Any authorized drives will be planned and scheduled at least 30 days in advance.

j. Deer hunting with dogs is prohibited.

k. Turkey hunting is authorized in accordance with state law.

l. Dogs may be utilized for all authorized waterfowl hunting areas, but only outside of general firearms season.

11. Weapons and Ammunition. The first violation of the provisions of this section will result in a one-week suspension of hunting privileges. Second violation may result in revocation of Fort Lee hunting privileges.

a. Authorized weapons and ammunition for deer hunting:

(1) Shotguns 20 through 10 gauges, buckshot only.

(2) Bows capable of propelling a nonpoisonous and non-explosive broad head arrow at least 125 Yards. Arrowhead widths must be at least 7/8 inch wide or expand upon impact to 7/8 inch.

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(3) Muzzleloader rifles or muskets, .45 caliber and larger, firing a single bullet. Modern in-line muzzleloaders and scopes are authorized.

(4) Crossbows are permit in accordance with the State of Virginia game laws.

b. Authorized weapons and ammunition for small game.

(1) Shotguns .410 through 10 gauges are permitted, but lead shot are prohibited for waterfowl hunting. The use of centerfire and rimfire rifles is prohibited on Fort Lee. Shotguns with shot no larger than number 2 fine are authorized during spring gobbler season.

(2) Bows and arrows as described in (2) and (4) above.

12. Safety Regulations. Violation of the following safety practices will result in a seven-day suspension of hunting privileges.

a. The safety of all weapons must be engaged until ready to fire.

b. All weapons will remain unloaded until hunter is in his stand. Weapons will be unloaded when ascending or descending from the stand. Muzzleloaders will be capped or primed after ascending stand and de-capped or de-primed prior to descending from stand.

c. All hunters (firearms, archery, and muzzleloaders) and any person accompanying a hunter during firearms season are required to wear a blaze orange vest (covering the chest, back, and shoulders) and blaze orange headgear external to all other clothing at all times during the general firearms season.

d. There is no requirement for archers and muzzleloaders to wear blaze orange during the early archery and muzzleloader seasons; however, once general firearms season begins, blaze orange (headgear and vest) is required.

e. Shotguns and muzzleloaders may be used only in designated areas. See map and log book at Outdoor Rec for details.

f. Firearms and muzzleloaders may not be discharged within 100 yards of any dwelling or occupied building except on an approved range.

g. Archery equipment should not be discharged within 50 yards of any dwelling or occupied building except on an approved range.

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h. Minors under the age of 18 using a firearm or muzzleloader or under 16 years of age using archery equipment must be under the immediate control of their parent or other responsible adult. Immediate control is defined as being within voice control and eyesight (no farther than 50 yards).

13. Wildlife Management Hunting Program Executive Council.

a. The primary purpose of the Hunting Council is to establish and maintain a safe and productive hunting program on Fort Lee.

b. To address and make recommendations to the Garrison Commander or delegated representative for improvements in the hunting program.

c. Ensure timely approval of hunting regulation updates, changes, and establishes fees for all classes of hunters.

d. Provide an avenue for all military and civilian members of the Fort Lee community to express concerns about the hunting program.

e. The Hunting Council will consist of a representative from EMO, PMO, Safety, DPTMS, FMWR, and a representative from the hunting community. A representative from SJA may be included as an advisor to the Council. A representative from Internal Review and Audit Compliance (IRAC) may sit in on meetings if issues emerge that warrant IRAC participation.

f. The DPTMS will serve as chairperson and the Safety Manager will serve as the Alternate Chairperson.

g. The Hunting Council will meet quarterly at a minimum and will provide minutes of each meeting to the Council Chairperson for final approval. Minutes will be forwarded by the Chairperson to the Garrison Commander as appropriate.

14. Responsibilities.

a. Garrison Commander.

(1) Overall responsibility for the Fort Lee hunting and wildlife management program.

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(2) Has exclusive approval authority for the use of normally restricted areas for hunting activities.

(3) Has exclusive authority to authorize special hunting activities such as organized drives, etc.

b. DPW.

(1) Implements and executes the operational functions of wildlife management under all appropriate DOD/Army regulations and Army pamphlets.

(2) Develops a wildlife management program that provides guidance on the types and number of game available for harvest. The program includes the development of precepts for each hunting season outlining harvest requirements supporting wildlife management goals and objectives.

(3) Develops a coordinated conservation program paralleling the land and forest management program. This program will consider both wildlife food plots and habitat improvement.

(4) Establishes proper guidelines for the protection of endangered species of plants and animals.

c. FMWR. Plans and supervises the recreational aspects of the hunting program including:

(1) Selling post-hunting permits.

(2) Operates game check station and game dressing facility.

(3) Schedules in advance available training land for hunting via RFMSS.

(4) Coordinates daily with DPTMS for hunting areas and signs hunters in/out of these areas.

(5) Coordinates with Safety, DPW, PMO, and DPTMS in placing and maintaining deer stands and hunting area boundaries.

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(6) Promotes safe hunting on Fort Lee through:

- (a) Mandatory post hunting briefings before being allowed to hunt on Fort Lee.
- (b) Publicize hunting seasons through available Government and commercial media.
- (c) Clearly mark "hunting" and "no hunting" areas where appropriate.

(7) Provides Installation Game Warden with information for the enforcement of this regulation.

(8) Marks and maintains access routes to and from deer stands.

(9) Attend Range/Training Area Certification Course.

d. DPTMS.

(1) Make available to FMWR a list of range areas available for hunting 30 days in advance. The list will be updated daily.

(2) Make training areas available for hunting if scheduled training is cancelled.

(3) Allocate range and training areas for hunting IAW CASCOM&FL 350-1.

e. PMO. The Provost Marshal is the Chief Game Warden for Fort Lee and will;

(1) Enforce all federal, state, and Post game laws and regulations.

(2) Coordinates with federal game wardens and state game wardens as appropriate.

(3) Appoints Fort Lee Game Warden(s).

f. Installation Safety Office.

(1) Reviews and advises Installation Commander on safety aspects of the Fort Lee hunting program.

(2) Includes counter measures in the Safety Program that will reduce the number of vehicle/deer accidents.

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(3) Assists the Hunting Council with the risk assessment of proposed hunting areas, method of harvest, access lanes, and boundaries.

g. Hunting Personnel Representative.

(1) Provides an avenue for all active and authorized members of the Fort Lee community to express concerns about the hunting program.

(2) Addresses and makes recommendations to the Hunting Council for improvements to the hunting program.


(3) Assists in coordinating volunteers to FMWR to support the recreational aspects of the hunting program.

(4) The designated representative will participate on the Hunting Council.

h. SJA. The SJA may provide administrative and criminal law support.

i. IRAC. Upon request, IRAC will audit the hunting program.

15. The proponent for this policy is the Directorate of Public Works.

APPENDIX B
PERMIT FEES AND AUTHORIZED HUNTERS

B-1. All personnel authorized to hunt on Fort Lee (including guests) must attend the Fort Lee Hunting Safety Brief annually. These briefings will be scheduled before hunting season and posted at the FMWR hunting facility.

B-2. All personnel authorized to hunt on Fort Lee (including guests) must provide proof that they have passed the Virginia State Hunters Education Course or a similar course from another state before they purchase the Fort Lee permit.

B-3. Anyone (including guests) wishing to hunt on Fort Lee must pass a proficiency test with each weapon type annually. There will be a qualification charge to cover the cost of target damage. Qualification will be good for one year.

B-4. Authorized hunters are:

- a. Active duty military members and their immediate dependant family members.
- b. Active duty Reservist and National Guard members.
- c. Retired military and their ID card holding immediate family members.
- d. DOD and NAF Civilians assigned/attached to Fort Lee and their immediate family members.
- e. Retired DOD/NAF civilians.
- f. Reservists and National Guard personnel not on active duty.
- g. Off-post civilians may hunt as a sponsored guest of one of the above on either a daily or annual basis. Sponsored daily guests must physically hunt the same day as their sponsor. Sponsored annual guests may hunt without their sponsor being present. All hunter qualification requirements must be met by all sponsored hunters, including the requirement to attend annual post safety briefings, possession of a state certified Hunters Safety Course, and the passage of applicable weapon qualifications. Sponsors are responsible for their guests.

B-5. Fees. The fee schedule will include a hunting permit fee and will be established by FMWR. Any fees collected should comply with the requirements in AR 200-3, paragraphs 6-3b, c, and d.

APPENDIX C
RELEASE AND HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT

I, Ima Good Hunter, voluntarily participate in hunting on Fort Lee. I agree that I am assuming the risk of all personal injuries, death, and property damage, which may occur as a result of taking part in this outdoor activity. These include such injuries or damage that may be caused by:

IGH – the inherent risks of hunting and the use of firearms. I acknowledge I use extreme caution while hunting on Fort Lee. I fully accept the risk of this and agree to hold the US, Fort Lee and its employees harmless in the event such an incident occurs;

IGH – hazards incident to hunting in military training areas; to include but not limited to duds, mines, barbed wire, or foxholes;

IGH - the negligent acts of other hunters;

IGH - any dangerous condition, known or unknown, that exists in the military training areas;

IGH - any other negligent or non-negligent act of Fort Lee or the Directorate of Public Works.

APPENDIX D
DEER MANAGEMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

D-1. This program is adopted from and works in concert with the Virginia Deer Management Plan, developed and produced by the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (VDGIF). The Fort Lee Deer Management Assistance Program (DMAP) is designed to help control and manage the deer herd on Fort Lee. The plan addresses six areas: populations, habitat, damage, recreation, education, and administration.

a. Population control goal. The cultural carrying capacity is the maximum number of deer that can coexist with humans. This goal is to manage the deer population at the desired local cultural carrying capacity, while maintaining a healthy and viable herd.

b. Habitat Goal. To manage deer habitats consistent with deer population objectives while maintaining a diverse and healthy floral and faunal landscape.

c. Damage Goal. To manage and reduce the urban, ecosystem, vehicular, forestry, and other deer damage.

d. Recreational Goal. To maximize the opportunity for all Soldiers / family members / retirees to safely enjoy deer hunting and other wildlife-related recreational experiences.

e. Educational Goals. To educate Fort Lee's residents regarding safety, ethics, and benefits of deer as a resource, and deer related issues associated with ecology, management, and behavior.

f. Administrative Goals. Develop a program that will become financially self-supporting.

D-2. Fort Lee DMAP Rules.

a. Harvest requirements are subject to change every season and will be published at the Outdoor Rec Hunting facility at the beginning of each season. These may involve mandatory harvesting of does during some times, or for some periods, a violation of which may result in suspension of Fort Lee hunting privileges for the remainder of the current hunting season.

b. DMAP tags will be issued on a first-come, first-serve basis and will be valid for use on both the cantonment area and Range Complex.

c. One full jawbone MUST be removed from each deer harvested on Fort Lee and surrendered to Outdoor Rec. for documentation purposes. This is mandatory to remain in compliance with Fort Lee Hunting Regulations. Violation of this rule may result in suspension of hunting privileges on Fort Lee for the remainder of the current hunting season. Temporary exceptions to this policy may only be granted by the Game Warden.

APPENDIX E
GAME DRESSING FACILITY

E-1. The game dressing facility is the only approved location for dressing deer on-post, although initial field dressing can be carried out on the Range Complex and in the Blackwater Swamp area as long as the waste organs are not deposited in a wetland or area frequented by Soldiers. Deer will not be dressed in quarters, unit areas, motor pools, or any other facility on-post. After the deer has been skinned and quartered, the deer may be taken to quarters for final processing. Failure to comply with this requirement will result in a one-week suspension of hunting privileges. Second violation will result in suspension of Fort Lee hunting privileges for one calendar year from the date of infraction.

E-2. The game dressing facility fee will be included in the cost of the post permit.

E-3. Processed game must be removed within 72 hours. If game is not removed within 72 hours the harvest will be donated at discretion of the FMWR recreation manager.

E-4. The game dressing facility may be used to dress game harvested on-post or off-post. Additional FMWR fees may apply to game from off post.

E-5. Anyone using the game dressing facility is responsible for proper waste disposal and area clean up.

APPENDIX F
FOWL AND SMALL GAME HUNTING

F-1. Turkey Hunting.

- a. Turkey hunting is in accordance with Virginia State and Prince George County Regulations. Turkey hunting may be conducted from the ground.
- b. Electronic calls and dogs are not permitted to hunt turkey.
- c. It is unlawful to have in possession any shot larger than number 2 fine while hunting turkey.
- d. Bag limit is in accordance with Virginia State Hunting Regulations.
- e. Hunting areas will be signed out on a first-come, first-serve basis during fall turkey season. If a turkey hunter signs out an area, no deer hunting is authorized in that area.
- f. Hunting areas and hunter numbers are listed in Appendix H.

F-2. Goose Hunting.

- a. Geese may be hunted during season on certain areas within the Range Complex. See the maps and log book at Outdoor Rec. for details. Hunters will remain at least 100 yards east of River Road and fire only eastward toward the tree line.
- b. No decoys are allowed on roadsides.
- c. Non-permanent blinds must be used on waterfowl hunting areas on the Range Complex. Blinds must be removed at the end of the hunting day.
- d. Dogs may be utilized for all waterfowl hunting, including hunting in Blackwater Swamp area, but only after the close of general firearms season.
- e. Hunters must have permission from adjacent landowners prior to retrieving game from their land.
- f. Blaze Orange is required in accordance with state regulation and additionally Fort Lee requires waterfowl hunters shall wear blaze orange while traveling to and from blind, but are not required to wear blaze orange while actually in the blind hunting.

F-3. Small Game Hunting.

- a. Small game hunting is permitted on Fort Lee in accordance with Virginia State Hunting Regulations
- b. No dogs are allowed to hunt squirrels or rabbits until after deer season closes. Dogs will only be used in the Range Complex. If a dog begins to chase deer it must be removed immediately from the area. Hunters using dogs must ensure all dogs are retrieved.

c. All small game will be hunted using shotguns with small fine shot and bows only.

F-4. Other Game Species. Other game species may be hunted in accordance to Virginia State Hunting regulations.

F-5. G-North is authorized for Dove hunting.


F-6. Hunters must remove all spent rounds, cases, and trash from the hunting area.
