Public Invited to Fort Lee Army Birthday Celebration

Fort Lee will celebrate the Army's 239th birthday June 17 with a cake cutting ceremony at 2:30 p.m. in the Lee Theater.

The ceremony includes the traditional cake-cutting by the youngest and oldest Soldiers and the newest and longest-serving Civilians. Maj. Gen. Larry D. Wyche will be the keynote speaker at the event which will conclude with over 300 community members the singing of "The Army Goes Rolling Along." The celebration event also features the premiere of the Fort Lee Virtual Choir video.

The Virtual Choir project combines the voices of community members, soldiers and civilian employees in a video presentation of the Army's song - "The Army Goes Rolling Along."

The event is open to the public and refreshments will be available after the ceremony. All adult visitors must present valid government-issued

Army Entertainment will bring the renowned show to Williams Stadium at Fort Lee on June 25 at 7:30 p.m. The 80-minute production is open to the

public and features music, dancing, and a cast of talented Soldiers from every corner of the nation and several military bases overseas.

"What I like about this year's show is that it tells the Army story by showcasing those things that instill strength and character in our Soldiers and their families, inspiring them to exemplify Army values and take care of themselves and each other," said Lt. Gen. David Halverson, commander of Installation Management Command, the headquarters element for Army Entertainment and the Soldier Show.



Those planning to attend the performance here are reminded that a current government- or state-issued identification card with photo is required for anyone 18 years of age or older to access the installation. Guests may bring lawn chairs or blankets for seating. Bleachers also are available. In the event of inclement weather, the show will be postponed to the following evening.
